From your favorite Pastor

We are in summer now, and there are kids out everywhere playing. Serving as chaplain for the Sheriff's office causes me to have other thoughts as well during this time of year. I get the unfortunate experience of seeing and learning about the dark underside of society and the world. The main issue to me is that there are those that want to take advantage of our kids and other defenseless people. For those that joined us in our screening of *The Sound of Freedom*, you saw a first-hand account of this terrible evil. The issue of human trafficking has become a passion of mine, and I have a strong desire to fight it as best I can.

This is an evil that we are supposed to fight as Christians. We are called in James 1:27 to care for widows and orphans: "*Pure and genuine religion in the sight of God the Father means caring for orphans and widows in their distress and refusing to let the world corrupt you.*" We are also called throughout Scripture to protect and stand for justice and righteousness, which is often tied into caring for widows and orphans. Isaiah 1:17 says: "*Learn to do good. Seek justice. Help the oppressed. Defend the cause of orphans. Fight for the rights of widows.*" We are clearly called to fight for, defend, and work to help those that can't help themselves. This work can take many different forms from physically saving people being trafficked, financially supporting organizations that do, or just being willing to give information to authorities about something suspicious. So with all that in mind I want to share some information for you to have as you travel this summer.

The #2 major crime in the U.S. now is human trafficking. The great state of Michigan ranks #2 in the U.S. in human trafficking, and it is very close to becoming an epidemic in Shiawassee county. It has become so prevalent that the Shiawassee Sheriff's office has begun it's own task force to fight it here. There are different aspects to the overall issue of trafficking, which I don't have time for now. I do know we all see it and don't even know it, and it is something we will really see during the summer months. So here are some simple things for you to utilize if you suspect you are seeing it. To find out what to look for you can go to two different resources. If you see something suspicious, there is an anonymous hotline to call that I want you to put into your phone for easy access, 888-373-7888.

I also challenge you to watch a short, true story movie, "The Fields of Mudan." Warning: this is not for the faint, but it is a real story about a young girl. (Can be found on YouTube) I encourage you to stand up for those that can't stand for themselves and be like Christ!

Don't twist the Word to fit your life instead, you should untwist your life to fit the Word

Scripture

Numbers 23:19

"God is not human, that he should lie, not a human being, that he should change his mind. Does he speak and then not act? Does he promise and not fulfill?"

Does God change His mind? Some skeptics point to certain passages – including the book of Jonah – to argue that God randomly changes His mind. They say this contradicts this present verse. The Bible says God is omniscient ("all-knowing") and is surprised by nothing. From the human point of view, it may appear that God changes His mind, but He hasn't changed it from His perspective. Rather, He has responded to changing human attitudes that He foreknew would occur. In Jeremiah 18:7-10, God said through Jeremiah that when He announces judgment on a nation, it will happen unless the nation "turns from its evil." If the nation repents, said God, then "I will relent concerning the disaster I had planned to do to it." The same is true for the benefits that God promises. If we disobey Him, He may choose to withhold some of the good of which He has spoken. These conditional promises set up possible scenarios in which God may choose to do something other than what He previously spoke, whether it was a blessing or a curse.

1 Samuel 28:5-20

Some people have pointed to this passage as justification for participating in seances or other dealing with spirits and the dead. Yet even if it is possible to communicate with the dead, the Bible very clearly says that attempting to do so is wrong (Leviticus 19:31; 20:27; Deuteronomy 18:10-12; Isaiah 8:19). The consequences for disobeying God in this matter were sometimes very dramatic. 1 Chronicles 10:13-14 explains that Saul's unfaithfulness in this matter ended up costing his life. As Ephesians 6:12 puts it, we are not in a battle against flesh and blood but rather "spiritual forces of evil". For the time being, this earth is essentially Satan's territory. Satan is not to be trusted, as he is likened to a roaring lion on the prowl, looking for easy targets and new victims (1 Peter 5:8). By getting involved with witchcraft, Ouija boards, and other demonic practices, we open ourselves up to a world that is much more dark and dangerous than we could ever imagine.


4th of July Fubl

MATERIALS NEEDED

- * Table Salt
- * Paper (black really makes the colors pop)
- watercolors (Or you can use food coloring and an eye dropper)
- * Brushes
- * White Glue
- * Cookie Sheet

Directions:

- 1. Start by laying your paper on a cookie sheet so the salt doesn't get all over the place.
- 2. Draw out your design with the glue. It works better if you do it thick. If you aren't comfortable free handing a design, draw it out with a white crayon or colored pencil first.
- 3. Next, sprinkle salt over the glue before it dries. Apply generously! You want to get everything covered. Shake off excess salt onto your tray.
- 4. Get your watercolors really wet, and lightly paint onto the salt. You can use food coloring and an eye dropper here if you'd prefer. You don't want to drag it too much or it will mess up the salt. I tried to get my brush extra drippy so I barely had to tap the design. Have fun with colors! It looks great when they bleed together.
- 5. Let project dry completely and you are done! You will love how the salt sparkles when its all dry.






Crockpot Pizza Casserole 🎄

Ingredients:

- 1 lb uncooked 95 to 97% lean ground beef ~ 12 oz cooked (2 Leaners)
- 1 tsp garlic powder (2 Condiments)
- 3/4 tsp salt (3 Condiments)
- 1/4 tsp black pepper (1/2 Condiment)
- 1 tsp dried oregano leaves (1 Condiment)
- 1 tsp dried basil whole leaves (1/2 Condiment)
- 1/4 cup fresh grated parmesan cheese (4 Condiments)
- 2 cups (7.04 oz) roughly chopped fresh cauliflower (4 Greens)
- 2 cups low carb marinara sauce (8 Greens)
- 1 and 1/2 cups reduced fat shredded mozzarella cheese (1 1/2 leans)
- 2.5 oz turkey pepperoni slices, divided (1/2 Lean)
- Directions:
- Over medium high heat, cook ground beef in a large skillet. Add garlic powder, salt, and pepper. Drain grease. Remove from heat.
- Add dried oregano, dried basil, cauliflower, parmesan cheese, marinara sauce and 1 oz of turkey pepperoni that has been cut into fourths to the ground beef until combined. Pour into a slow cooker that has been sprayed lightly with cooking spray.
- Cook on LOW for 4 to 6 hours.
- Top with mozzarella cheese and additional 1 ounce of turkey pepperoni. Cook for an additional 30 min on HIGH or until cheese has melted.

- 1 Lean, 3 Greens, and 3 Condiments per serving



- Slow Cooker Crack Chicken YUM!!
- Ingredients:
- 2 lbs boneless chicken breasts
- 4 ounces low fat cream cheese
- 3 1/2 teaspoons dry Ranch seasoning
- 8 oz low sodium turkey bacon, cooked crisply and crumbled
- Instructions
- 1. In a slow cooker place chicken, cream cheese, and Ranch seasoning.
- 2. Cook on low for 6-8 hours or on high for 4 hours, until chicken shreds easily.
- 3. Once chicken shreds stir with a large fork or spoon, so the chicken shreds and all the ingredients combine.
- 4. Add in crumbled bacon and stir to incorporate.
- 5. Serve warm
