From your favorite Pastor!

In the upcoming election we are seeing an incredible amount of commercials because Michigan is a

battleground state. One thing that has really stood out to me is what the campaigns are attacking about their opponents, in particular those that I tend to support. If you attended our first Sunday evening service (another one coming up on October 6 @ 7pm), you heard my case for Biblical voting. One of the main issues I brought up was life, in particular being pro-life and that we need to consider a candidate's position on this when we vote.

The stance for life entails more than just one part of life, as most people consider abortion to be the issue of life. While it is obviously crucial, it is only one part of it as voting for life also includes infanticide and physician assisted suicide/euthanasia. The Bible clearly states that we are to be pro-life and that there is no choice for mankind to have in this area. God tells us that we are from Him from conception, that He created us (Psalm 139:13-16; Jeremiah 1:5; Isaiah 49:1; Luke 1:41-44; Galatians 1:15). He also told us that every life is in His hands (Exodus 20:13; Exodus 23:7; 2 Kings 8:12; Matthew 18:10; Mark 10:14-16). Every life matters from the moment of conception to the moment of death and that those events are providentially controlled by God.

Alright, back to my original thing. Every commercial I see that opposes candidates I support focuses on their pro-life beliefs. Almost every celebrity I hear endorse a candidate says they are doing so because they support "reproductive rights," which is a not-so-subtle pro-death support. These are the same people that stand at rallies screaming how proud they are of the abortions they've had, while lecturing pro-life people about how hateful we are for wanting to save those lives. Understand me, this is a spiritual battle that we as believers need to engage in.

One way we are trying to help you do that is by hosting a movie night on Sept. 29 @ 7pm. We will be showing "The 1916 Project" by Seth Gruber, the founder of White Rose Resistance. This movie gives us the history of Planned Parenthood and the pro-death movement of the last century. I highly encourage you to attend and invite someone to come with you. You can also go on our YouTube channel and watch the Sunday night service from September 8.

Twisted Scripture

Pg 1005 Apologetics Bible

Matthew 3:15-17

Jesus replied, "Let it be so now; it is proper for us to do this to fulfill all righteousness." Then John consented.

As soon as Jesus was baptized, he went up out of the water. At that moment heaven was opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased."

Members of cults and non-Christian religions take issue with Christian teaching about God's nature, particularly the doctrine of the trinity. Critics point to this passage as evidence that the New Testament teaches tri-theism (three gods). After all, it is argued, there are three distinct divinities referenced here: the Father, whose voice comes out of heaven, the Son, who is being baptized by John the Baptist; and the Holy Spirit, who came down upon Jesus as a dove. Therefore, how can Christians speak of God as one when this clearly shows He is three?

The answer is that God is One in essence (Deuteronomy 6:4; Mark 12:29), yet three in Person: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. That is no contradiction, for God is One in one thing (what He is – His unified, divine essence) and three in another (*who* He is – three individual Persons making up the Trinity). Each member is distinct from the others, and so they are described as distinct, and yet they share equally and eternally in the divine essence, making them fundamentally unified.

Pg 1024 Apologetics Bible

Matthew 18:19-20

"Again, truly I tell you that if two of you on earth agree about anything they ask for, it will be done for them by my Father in heaven. For where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them."

Some Christians take this verse to mean that the Spirit of Jesus comes around only if two or three Christians are gathered together. However, context indicates that this is a mistaken conclusion. The topic of Matthew 18 is church discipline, where an errant Christian is confronted about his or her ongoing sin. Jesus promised in verse 17 that He would be present whenever the church leaders met together to resolve difficult situations such as these (also see 1 Corinthians 5:4). Later, Jesus told His disciples that He would be with them always, even to the end of the age (Matthew 28:19-20). He did not say it would take two or more of them to make this a reality. If Matthew 8:19-20 really did say that two or three believers are needed for Christ to be present, by implication we should never read our Bible alone or pray by ourselves. Yet Jesus emphasized the importance of privately coming to God (Matthew 6:6), and so we know He is present with us even when we are alone.

Supplies for DIY Glass Cracked Gems and Stones Clear, flat backed glass gems size large and size small.

Nail polish -various colors

- Baking sheet
- Bowl for ice water

Necklace cord (optional)

Pendant hanger (optional)

Ring blanks for jewelry making (optional)

E6000 glue (optional)

Directions for Making DIY Cracked Glass Stones and Gems

Step 1: Place glass gems on a baking sheet and put them into the oven, heated to 425 degrees, for 20 minutes.

Step 2. A few minutes before the gems are done baking, put some water and ice in a bowl.

Step 3. As soon as the stones are done baking put them into the ice water. The gems will crack immediately. *CAUTION:* Wear protective eyewear in the rare case a gem explodes when you put it into the water. It's highly unlikely this would happen, but always good to be cautious.

Step 4. On the flat side of the cracked stones, paint with nail polish.

Step 5. To create jewelry glue a finished cracked glass gem onto to a ring blank or for necklaces, glue to a pendant hanger and add to a necklace cord. If you don't want to use the glass-cracked gems for jewelry, you can use them for other craft projects. Turn them into magnets or use them as embellishments and decor on wooden boxes and canvases. They would also make beautiful vase filler.

Caramelized Onion Spaghetti Squash Casserole

YIELD: 5 Serving

PER SERVING: 1/2 ounce Protein, 3 Green, 1 Condiment & 1 1/4 Fat

INGREDIENTS:

2 1/2 cups cooked spaghetti squash

2 cups chopped scallions

1 cup chopped baby Portobello mushrooms

1 cup Rao's Marinara sauce

1/2 cup water

2 Tbsp extra-virgin olive oil + extra

to coat pan

1 tsp garlic powder

1/2 tsp salt

1/2 tsp pepper

3 eggs, whisked

DIRECTIONS:

Preheat oven to 400. Grease 8x8 casserole w/pam.

Prepare spaghetti squash by oven or microwave.

In skillet heat, olive oil over medium-high heat, add scallions and mushrooms. Lower to medium cook 10 minutes or until browned.

Add water, stir, cook 8-10 minutes, until water's gone.

In bowl mix squash, mushrooms mix, marinara, garlic, and eggs until well mixed. Pour into casserole dish.

Bake 1 hour, until crust on top and edges are browned. Rest 10 minutes.



Skillet Cheesy Chicken & Veggie "Rice"

YIELD: 2 Serving

PER SERVING: 1 Leaner Protein, 3 Greens, 2 1/2 Condiments, 1 Fat

INGREDIENTS:

13-ounces chicken breast, cubed small

1/2 tsp salt

1/4 tsp garlic powder

1/4 pepper

2 tsp olive oil

2 cloves crushed garlic

1/4 cup chopped green onion

12 ounces riced cauliflower and broccoli

(Try Green Giant Riced

Cauliflower Broccoli)

1/2 cup reduced fat sharp cheddar

DIRECTIONS:

Season chicken w/1/4 tsp salt, garlic powder, and pepper.

Heat skillet over high heat. Add 1 tsp oil and

half the chicken.

Cook 2-3 minutes, until no pink in center and browned on the edges. Set aside.

Repeat w/remaining chicken.

On medium-heat cook remaining 1 tsp oil, onion and garlic 2 minutes. Add vegetables, 1/4 tsp salt, and pepper cook 5-6 minutes. Add chicken and cheese cover. Cook on low 2-3 minutes.


